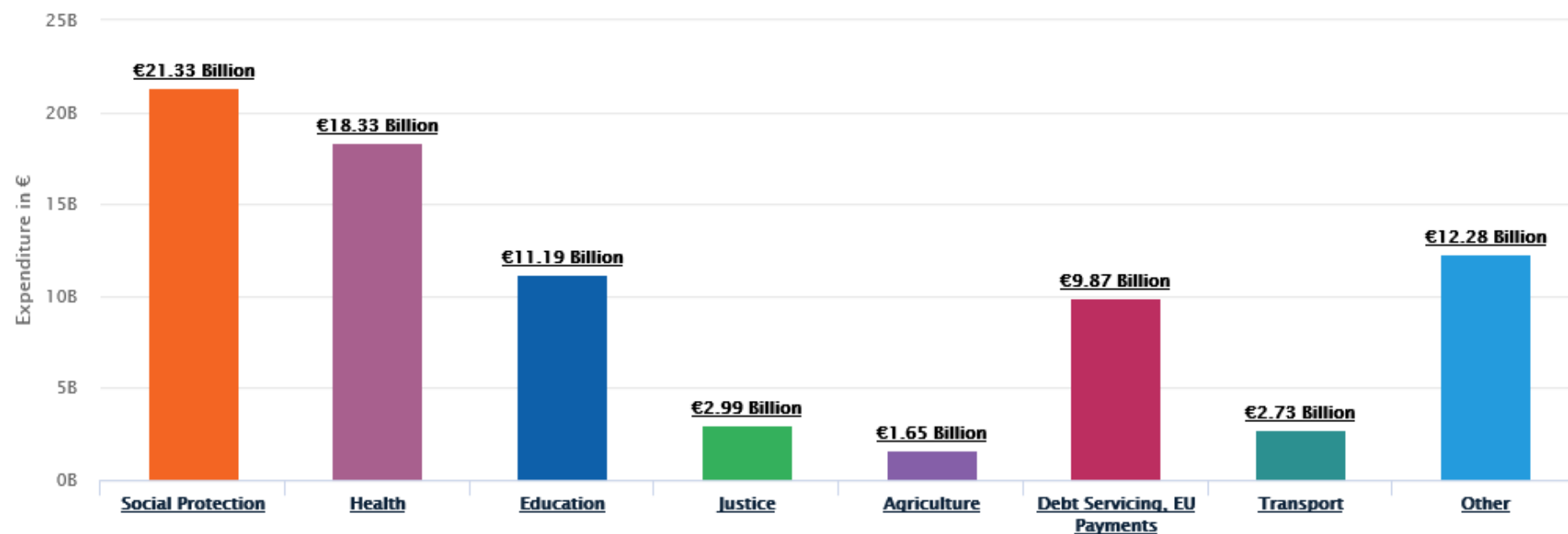

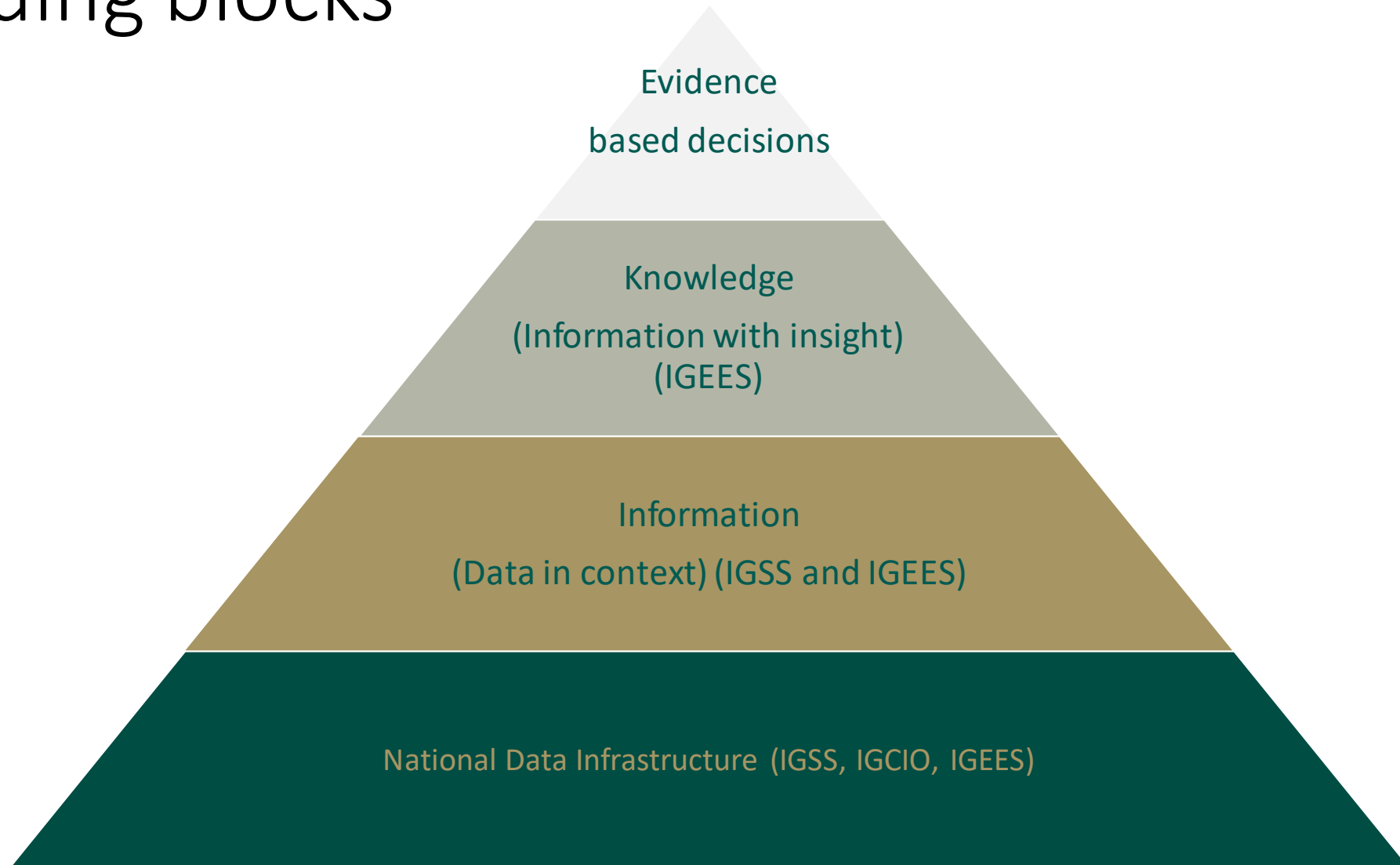

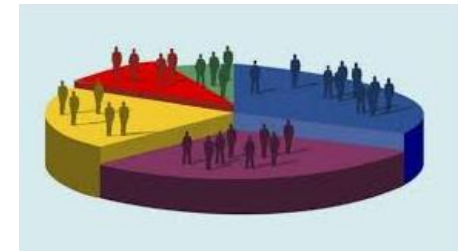

Do we know where in the business cycle Irish economy is? Can we estimate the output gap for Ireland? Is the EU methodology adequate for Ireland?

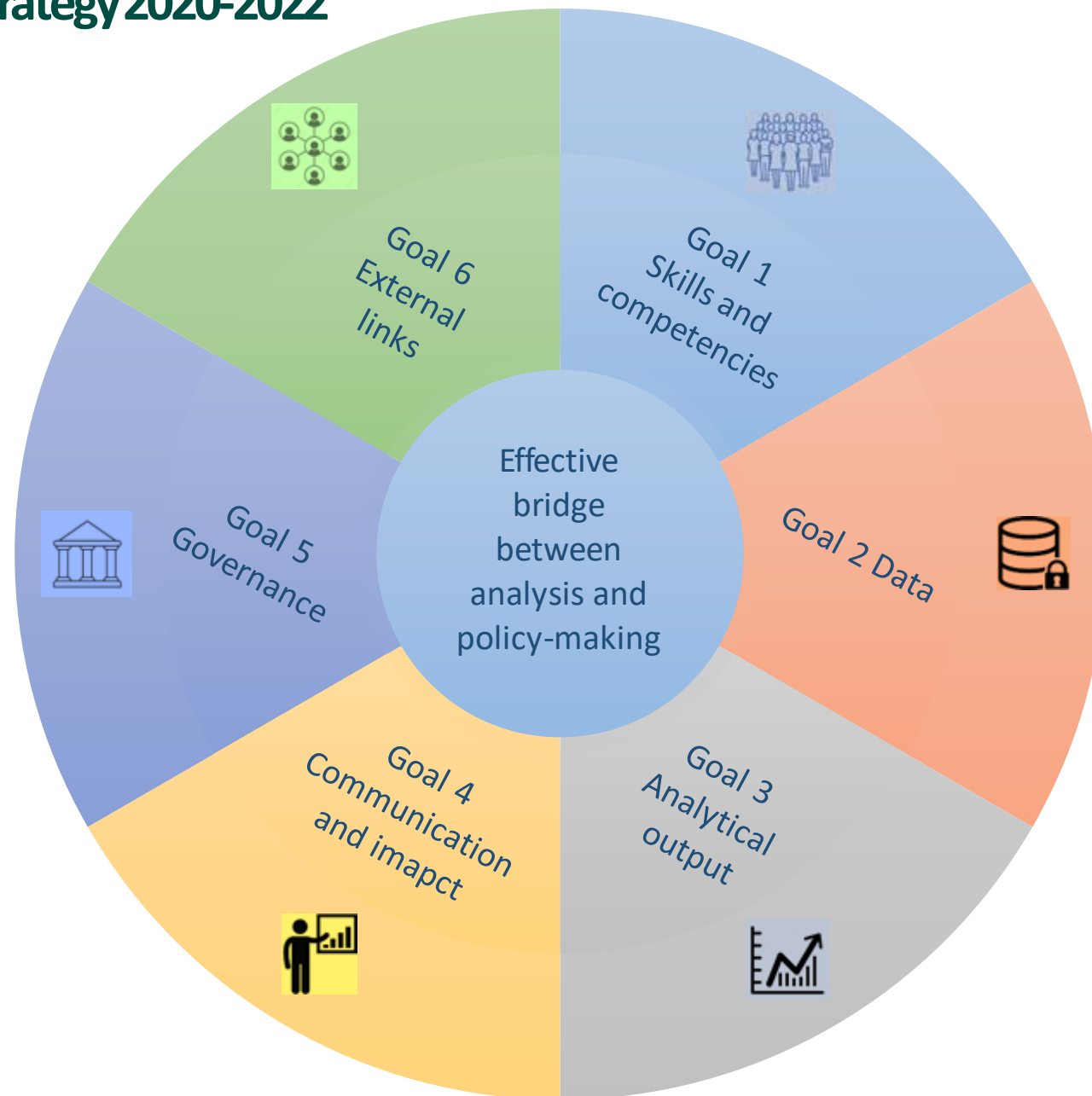


Is the State cost of medicines per capita higher than it should be? What is the progress made in rebalancing the acute and primary care? What is the cost of medical and GP visitation cards?

IGEES shaping policy response to COVID 19

- Feeding into COVID19 National Public Health Emergency Team's work (Ministry of Health)
 - Hospital capacity
 - Flattening the curve
- Macroeconomic impact and forecasts (Ministry of Finance)
- Labour market impact of COVID19 (Ministries: Social Protection, Finance, Revenue and Expenditure)
 - Policy response regarding liquidity of households (unemployment and illness supports, wage subsidies)
- Economic impact of COVID19 (Ministries: of Business, Finance, Expenditure)
 - Policy response regarding liquidity of enterprise sector (credit access, grants, fixed costs)
 - Sectoral impact
 - International response
