1. PREFACE

Public Purchases on the Net platform is made up of several independent components, created and managed by different institutional parties, which are interoperable thanks to the use of common interfaces and formats.


The logical architecture of the system consists of the following elements:

- ✓ a defined set of *documents with standardized contents and formats* (electronic order, electronic invoice, payment order, etc.);
- ✓ an orchestrator system, consisting of the <u>Piattaforma dei Crediti Commerciali</u> (<u>PCC</u>), which collects the information contained in the transactions, manages its consistency and uses it to feed the <u>Banca Dati delle Amministrazioni Pubbliche</u> (<u>BDAP</u>);
- ✓ three routing nodes (NSO, SDI and SIOPE+), which have the function of managing
 and tracking the exchange of documents in electronic format between the actors
 of the process (suppliers, public administrations and banks), also through
 intermediaries (central purchasing bodies, consortia of companies, etc.);
- ✓ some *databases*, such as the <u>Banca Dati Nazionale dei Contratti Pubblici (BDNCP)</u> and the Sistema informativo sulle operazioni degli enti pubblici (SIOPE)
- ✓ other systems (SIMOG, NoTIER, SICOGE Enti).

Some of the mentioned systems (PCC, BDAP, SDI, BDNCP) are already fully usable, others are currently available only to certain sectors of public administration (SIOPE+, NSO).

The diagram of operation of the platform is shown in the following figure.






2. THE BENEFITS OF THE PLATFORM

The integration of the mentioned systems will ensure the tracking of all the phases of public administrations procurement process, which can be summarized in four distinct but closely related stages: contract, order, billing and payment.

In the following figure, for illustrative purposes only, some possible scenarios are illustrated. As you can see, starting from any of the stages of the supply chain, it is always possible to reconstruct the whole process.





Public Purchases on the Net platform will make the public administration procurement process more transparent and more efficient.

For example, suppliers (or other successors in title, such as credit assignees), through profiled access to the *Piattaforma dei Crediti Commerciali*, will be able to check if their invoices have been paid, while public bodies will be able to monitor progress in their purchase orders execution.

In addition, citizens and other stakeholders (such as media), consulting the *Banca Dati delle Amministrazioni Pubbliche*, will have more information on public spending on goods and services.
